## BILL ADAIR

As well as being a fine guitar player, Bill Adair is one of Scotland's busiest and most respected singer/songwriters.

Combining influences from folk and blues, Bill's music addresses universal themes of love, work, loss and redemption. Equally at home singing a traditional Scottish ballad, blues from the Mississippi Delta, or one of his own songs, Bill's performances are complemented by a natural story-telling style that is both thought-provoking and entertaining. From his home base near Glasgow, Bill is much in demand at festivals and folk clubs all over the UK, and also has a reputation as an interpreter of the poems and songs of Robert Burns and performs at Burns Suppers throughout the country.

## THE BRENDAN McCREANOR TRIO

were formed in the summer of 2010, with the purpose of creating a new sound, based on the fusion of Irish Uilleann pipes and Scottish fiddle. Brendan McCreanor is a talented Irish musician from the village of Dunleer in County Louth. He graduated with a B.A. (Honours) in Applied Music from the Dundalk

Institute of Technology, and since then, has been making his name in the Irish traditional music scene, by playing in sessions both in Ireland and all over Europe, teaching music and working as a session musician. He plays uilleann pipes and whistle and is also an accomplished vocalist. Highlights of his musical career so far have been playing three times to the Irish president Mary McAleese and also to a 2000 strong crowd of Irish Traditional music fans in Malta.

He is joined in his latest venture by two stalwarts of the Scottish folk music scene, Stevie Lawrence on guitar and bouzouki, and Fiona Cuthill on fiddle. Stevie and Fiona have played together in many folk music bands in the past, including Rallion, Real Time and Canterach and also play as a duo. They have toured across Europe for many years and have been playing music together for over 15 years. This lends a solid base and flexibility to the band and the ability to entertain any audience.

## THE RACHEL HAIR TRIO
